Requests to all road users

There have been a number of reports regarding the excessive speeds of vehicles in the parish and one instance where inconsiderate driving led to an animal being hit. The winding nature of our local roads means that it is often impossible to see other road users until too late, especially if both are driving too fast. Please drive with caution so that we, animal and human, can all be safer. With the nesting season approaching it is worth remembering that few birds can escape a car going faster than 40 mph and there are few places in the parish where 30 mph can safely be exceeded.

Mud on roads

With the torrential rain this winter the state of fields have been truly dreadful. Agricultural vehicles are increasing in size and access to fields often leads to dangerous quantities of mud on road surfaces. Many considerate landowners clean up afterwards and some do not. It is worth remembering that signage alone does not exonerate landowners from responsibility for traffic safety.

There are many eye wateringly large legal settlements brought against farmers/contractors for accidents of this kind. Be aware!

Sheep worrying

Unfortunately there has been a recent incident in the parish of dogs worrying sheep. Please can all dog owners be aware of their responsibilities so that any recurrence can be avoided. Livestock owners should keep a diary of any occurrences of this kind to use when making reports. Dog owners should remember that farmers have every right to shoot dogs running free amongst livestock.

Parish precept

The Parish precept (the parish share of the council tax) has been increased by $\pounds 5.00$ to an annual parish total of $\pounds 1,130$. Because of the way the amounts are calculated based on the number of council tax payers, this represents a reduction of 2p for a band D property for the year.

MARLAND SCHOOL

Marland School is pleased to announce that new residential accommodation may be built for the students. A purpose designed and built block comprising of 26 bedrooms may be built adjacent to the new sports hall. This will allow the separation of the school and residential provision, a refurbishment of the existing bedrooms to provide a further 19 single bedrooms and lounges and other facilities would be the second phase of this project. The project is in its early stage and designs and plans have been drawn up, it has not yet gone to formal planning but a pre-planning enquiry has gone to Torridge District Council and the plans have also gone to Peters Marland Parish Council. A key design element is to make sure the building is appropriate to the setting; with choice of materials location, orientation etc. This is to minimise any impact on the landscape, neighbours and environment in general.
