## **Defibrillator**

The defibrillator is now installed on the wall of the Moore-Stevens Hall. The PIN to unlock the cabinet is held by South West Ambulance Service and will be given out to callers to the Emergency Services in cases where it is considered by them to be appropriate. The unit is fully automatic and gives instructions to the user as and when action is required. The Parish Council is very grateful to the Marland School who made a sizeable donation towards the cost of purchasing the defibrillator and cabinet. The balance has been paid from the Alscott Farm Community Benefit Fund.

## **Waste and Recycling**

## **Superfast Broadband**

Following work by BT Openreach, superfast broadband is now available in the Parish, although it is not clear whether all properties can benefit at present. If you are interested in upgrading to superfast broadband you will need to apply to your service provider who will advise you on availability.

## **Millennium Bench**

It is good to see that the Millennium Bench has been reinstated to the site by the Churchyard wall. The Parish Council are very grateful to George Copp and Michael Stapleton for their work in making the necessary new parts and rebuilding it.

Matters currently occupying the Council are, the proposed passing place on the road up Beacon Hill, which has been a long standing irritation and the night-time Helicopter Landing Site. This is currently proposed to be located somewhere on the Marland School playing field. Detailed negotiations with all agencies are ongoing but positive.
